On June 4, we will be delivering dozens of baby bottles filled with real stories, heartfelt messages and urgent data directly to lawmakers on Capitol Hill. These bottles carry the voices of those with the most to lose: babies, toddlers, young children and the families who care for them.

Quick fact: Centering expectant parents, babies and young children in advocacy messages is a compelling strategy for protecting programs that serve people of all ages and demographics.

## **Topline Message**

The "One Big Beautiful Bill Act"—also referred to as the reconciliation bill—cuts programs that babies, young children and their families need.

By investing in these early years, our nation can place babies, toddlers and young children on the best possible trajectory for lifelong success, ultimately creating stronger communities and a more resilient workforce.

Right now, Medicaid (which covers 41 percent of all births), is on the chopping block.

SNAP, which feeds 4.5 million kids under five, is under threat.

Babies need Medicaid. Moms need mental health care. Families need SNAP. And they need it now.



#### Post One:



## Key Stats to Strengthen the Message

#### **Medicaid Matters**

- Medicaid provides 56 percent of all federal funding to states.
- It covers 41 percent of all births nationwide.
- Nearly 40 percent of U.S. children are covered by Medicaid.
- In rural and small towns, 47 percent of children rely on Medicaid coverage.

#### **SNAP Saves Families**

- One in three families with children under 5 reported food insecurity in 2024.
- 4.5 million children under age five receive SNAP, including 1.7 million infants and 2.8 million toddlers.
- Households with young children receive 32 percent of all monthly SNAP benefits.
- A household with a preschool-aged child receives an average of \$140 in monthly SNAP support.
